Dear Families and Friends of St Andrew's School,

We are writing to wish you, your families and your friends a Happy and Blessed Christmas. The events of 2020 have shaken all of us. Perhaps the most difficult thing of all is living with so much uncertainty and the high levels of anxiety that accompany it. But in the midst of so much that is difficult, there have also been numerous acts of kindness and consideration, moments when light has pierced and overcome the darkness.
