# Growing and learning together with God

From midnight tonight, the whole of London is moving to Tier 2 restrictions; also known as local Covid alert level High. The main significance of this is that you must not socialise with anybody outside of your household or support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place. You also must not socialise in a group of more than 6 outside.

Understandably this may have implications for your childcare arrangements and you will need to make sure that you know who exactly is in your support bubble; such as which grandparents or extended family members.

With the rise in cases locally, and many schools in our area having had confirmed cases of Covid-19, it is more important now than ever before that we all act as responsible citizens. The government Hands, Face, Space campaign is actually very easy to understand. Please continue to wash your hands as much as possible, wear a face covering when inside, and give other people who are not part of your family or your support bubble space. I have been very worried to see some of our families hugging and touching other families at the beginning and end of the day. This is not permitted except with members of your own household.

So far this year we have been looking at different picture books in class with a social, emotional or moral theme, such as Ruby's Worry, Here We Are and After the Fall.




# **Welcome New Pupils**
