

English

First person narratives— the children will write a story from the point of view of a chosen character.

Shadow of Blue — character and comparative descriptions, figurative language, writing narrative, dialogue, recounts and diary entries.

The children will learn to read, plan, write and edit their work including a range of grammatical concepts learnt alongside the genres.

Spellings - review rules set out in the National Curriculum as well as the Year 5 and 6 word list.

Maths—White Rose Maths

We will be looking at converting units of measurement, measurement of perimeter, area and volume, ratio and proportion and properties of shape.

In addition to this, we will also be doing revision including: All four operations including long multiplication and division; calculations involving fractions, decimals and percentages; reasoning questions involving all areas of mathematics; and multistep problems.

RE— How does the Christian Festival of Easter offer Hope?

The children will be looking at how Christians believe the Easter Story helps people when they do wrong. They will consider the concepts of forgiveness, redemption, hope and salvation and how these are shown in the Easter story, thinking about what this means for Christians.

They will have the opportunity to learn about and reflect on the stations of the cross.

Year 6 Spring 2 West Africa

Science—Animals including humans

This term we will be looking at the circulatory system, Including identifying and naming the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describing the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood; recognising the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function and describing the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animal, including humans.

All aspects of scientific knowledge will be taught using working scientifically skills.

Computing—Spreadsheets

Formatting and using specific formulas; solving problems; and creating a spreadsheet.
