- \*At St. Andrew's we believe that home learning will support and enhance children's progress.
- Nursery rhymes will be sent home to practice and learn as it part of phase 1 phonics.
- \*Discovery homework
- \*Children should research a topic and collect pictures, diagrams and important information. For example from the library, internet or encyclopaedia. Children should then display the work in the A4 book (2 to 6 pages). Children should have sub headings and include writing (mark making) and drawings. Also they can add printed pictures, diagrams or photographs. Children should be able to explain their work and what they have learnt about the topic.

### Healthy Lunches

- All children in Foundation and KS1 are entitled to a free school dinner. In KS2 children are able to bring a packed lunch or purchase a hot school meal. Please make sure you order school dinners online with The Pantry.
- Please provide your child with a balanced school lunch. Children are not allowed sweets, chocolate bars, fizzy drinks, cans or glass bottles in their lunchbox. All lunchboxes must be named.

 Please make sure all water bottles are labelled and are brought to school every day.

#### Environment

Although based in a busy part of Greater London, the surrounding trees and greenery provide a pleasant setting that enhances our provision for children. The grounds include a large grassed field; separate playgrounds for EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2; a woodland area, a prayer garden and an allotment space which is looked after by members of the school gardening club.

#### **Facilities**

All classes have access to the Music Room, laptop computers and the Library. All classrooms are fitted with interactive white boards, and children use laptops in class when taking part in ICT. There are also a number of small areas and rooms where children can work in small groups under the supervision of a Teaching Assistant. We have a school hall which is used for assemblies, serving lunch and for PE lessons. The large playground and field area is also used for PE and outdoor learning. Each class has an IPad for gathering evidence of learning and accessing Class Dojo.
