Personal, Social and Emotional <u>Development</u>

Begin to understand the rules and boundaries of nursery and children are proud if they are given praise or a sticker.

Begin to talk to and make friends with other children and grown-ups.

Make up ideas and things to do in play time for example making a cup of tea in the home corner.

Literacy

Shows increasing control in holding a variety of objects and tools such as jugs, cups and mark making tools.

Physical Development

Begin to show preference for a dominant hand, leg and foot. Explore different ways of moving like the characters in a story. Move in response to music or rhythms played on a musical instrument e.g. a drum or shaker.

Able to sit on a balance bike and scoot themselves along.

Communication and Language

Learning the new vocabulary necessary for Nursery routines, rules and boundaries.

Able to follow a simple

instruction such as 'can you give me the ball'. Able to talk about what we are doing now and what might happen later or tomorrow.

<u>Maths</u>

Able to select appropriate shapes for building for example know that a flat surface can be stacked.

Children can count up to 5 by rote especially when singing number songs or number rhymes with actions.

Expressive Arts and Design
