English

RE

In this unit we will begin to understand that religions have special times called festivals to remember what is important in that religion. We will be able to explain what is important to us and to know the right names for things that are special to Jews.

Art/DT

This half term we will use drawing and painting to develop and share our ideas, experiences and imagination. We will apply a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space. As part of our topic we will look at famous artists of the Victorian era and look to replicate some of their artwork.

Reading

Through the half-term we will be exploring a range of different genres of both fiction and non-fiction. These will include traditional tales and fairy tales that the we are familiar with, as well as a range of non-fiction texts.

During the half term we will continue to develop our skills in inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and being able to summaries what we have read.

Science

Uses of Everyday Materials

In this unit we will leam about the uses of everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, glass, brick, paper and cardboard. We will then go on to compare the suitability of different everyday materials for different purposes.

They explore how objects made of some everyday materials can change shape and how the recycling process is able to reuse some everyday materials numerous times.

Geography/History

The Victorian Era - 150th Anniversary

Through this unit we will be looking at the lives of significant individuals in the past, including Queen Victoria.

As a part of our school's 150th anniversary we will look at significant historical events, people and places in our local area.

Mathletics is a captivating online learning space providing students with all the tools they need to be successful learners, both in the classroom and beyond.




Clothing and PE


PE days are Tuesday (gymnastics) and Wednesday.

Environment

Although based in a busy part of Greater London, the surrounding trees and greenery provide a pleasant setting that enhances our provision for children. The grounds include a large grassed field; separate playgrounds for EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2; a woodland area, a prayer garden and an allotment space which is looked after by members of the school gardening club.

Facilities

All classes have access to the Music Room, laptop computers and the Library. All classrooms are fitted with interactive white boards, and children use laptops in class when taking part in ICT. There are also a number of small areas and rooms where children can work in small groups under the supervision of a Teaching Assistant. We have a school hall which is used for assemblies, serving lunch and for PE lessons. The large playground and field area is also used for PE and outdoor learning. Each class has an IPad for gathering evidence of learning and accessing Class Dojo.
