Maths—White Rose Maths

This term we will be doing revision including: All four operations including long multiplication and division; calculations involving fractions, decimals and percentages; reasoning questions involving all areas of mathematics; and multistep problems.

After SATs the children will be completing problem solving and reasoning challenges related to all areas of maths.

RE— This term we will be learning about the Contemporary Anglican Church.

Children will reflect on different practices within the Church of England, including those in the local parish church. They will learn about modern styles of worship in the Church of England as well as comparing similarities and differences across the Worldwide Anglican Church. In addition to this unit, they will be looking at the school vision: 'Growing and Learning together with God'. They will be reflecting and discussing about what this means to them.

Science—Animals including humans

This term we will be looking at the circulatory system, including identifying and naming the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describing the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood; recognising the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function and describing the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animal, including humans.

All aspects of scientific knowledge will be taught using working scientifically skills.
