### RE:

# Maths—White Rose Maths:

Addition and subtraction

Add and subtract two 2 -digit numbers crossing 10; Recall and use related facts fluently; find 10 more and 10 less of a 2digit number within 100; solve 2 step addition and subtraction problems. Shape

Recognise 2 D and 3 D shapes; count the sides and vertices on 2D shapes; count faces, edges and vertices on 3D shapes; find lines of symmetry on shapes.

## Science:

#### Materials

Explore different materials such as glass, wood, paper, brick, rock, plastic, metal and fabrics; identify their properties, if they are natural or man made and participate in investigations to identify materials which are waterproof, can be twisted, bent, squashed or stretched.
