Maths:

Multiplication and Division: Children will start to look at formal written methods, using partitioning and applying their understanding of Place Value. They will multiply and divide numbers up to 3-digits by 1-digit.

Area: We will explore what area is and how to count and calculate it on a range of different shapes.

Fractions: Children will learn about equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, as well as being able to work out fractions of amounts and problem solving.

RE:

The children will learn the following: Jesus made statements about himself, describing himself through symbolism; the 7 'I am...' statements of Jesus and their meaning to Christians; how the 'I am...' statements relate to the lives of Christians; creation of an 'I am...' statement by pupils for Jesus; and to consider how the meanings behind the statements are relevant in their lives.
