

English:

Kane and the mystery of the missing word cup by Adrian Lobley—writing narrative.

Poem—Pie Corbett

Maths—White Rose Maths:

Multiplication and division: Multiply up to a 4-digit number by a one digit number, short division, order of operations, identify common factors and multiples, and prime and square number .

Perimeter and area: Measure and calculate perimeters, including finding unknown lengths, finding the area of rectangles and compound shapes, estimate and approximate area.

Earth and Space:

Describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system.
