Maths—White Rose Maths:

Place value: read, write, compare and order numbers to 1,000,000; round to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 100,000; Roman numerals to 1000; counting on 10s, 100s, 1,000s, 10,000s and 100,000s.

Addition and subtraction: Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits; round to estimate and approximate; use inverse operations to check answers; solve multi-step addition and subtraction problems.

Multiplication and division: Multiply up to a 4-digit number by a one digit number; short division.
