The projects provide an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2. This gives the opportunity to ensure any possible gaps in understanding are addressed before children move on to secondary school.

RE:Rules and Responsibilities—Who decides?

Through this unit pupils will consider the implications of rules and responsibilities for belonging to communities and in particular of belonging to a faith community. Children will consider the rules in religions and other sources of authority. This unit contains work on rules, laws and responsibilities in society and in Christianity, Islam and Judaism .

**Science:**

Diet, drugs and lifestyle: Explore the impacts of diet, drugs and lifestyle on overall body health.

Adaptations Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

Fossils Explore fossils and know how they are formed. Learn about Mary Anning and her discoveries in south-west England.

Geography/History:

How did the geography of Greece influence Ancient Greek life? What impacted the life of the Ancient Greeks? What was their impact on the modern world? An enquiry into the city states. An enquiry into an aspect of Ancient Greece and its significance.

Computing:Sensing movement

Build in and test programmes and transfer them to a micro:bit

Art: Shadow puppets

Introduction to the art of paper cutting, and how it can be used and adapted to create shadow puppets. Explore shadow puppets from a historical and contemporary perspective before making their own puppets, exploring line, shape, form and character.

DT: Design a Fairground ride

Design, make and evaluate a fairground ride with gears or pulleys for younger children for a festival.

PSHE: RSE - Time to change (puberty), change and becoming independent, positive and healthy relationships and how a baby is made.
